On the Feast of Dedication, we commemorate the consecration of this building to the service of Almighty God (in the year 1853). It is a sign of God's presence with his people, whom he has redeemed by his Son; and a sign too that we who worship here in the faith of Jesus are also dedicated and consecrated to serve him in holiness and righteousness all the days of our lives.
