WELCOME TO ST. JOHN'S

For Guests and Visitors. We extend a warm welcome to guests and visitors worshipping with us. If this is your first visit to Saint John's, please let us know by filling out the visitor card in the pew and dropping it in the collection plate. Interactive Worship. The congregation participates actively in worship, and this booklet is a guide to taking part in it. For many parts of the service it will refer you to one of the two books in red bindings in the pew racks – the 1940 Hymnal, and the smaller 1928 Prayer Book.

Receiving Communion. Those visiting with us from other churches who are baptized and admitted to communion may receive the sacrament. Unless prevented by reason of infirmity, please kneel at the altar rail. To receive the host, place right hand over left, palms upward, and lifted to about chest level. To receive the chalice, hold head erect, and place hands on base or bowl to guide it to your mouth. If you prefer, leave the host visible in your open hand and the minister will dip it for you, and place it on your extended tongue. If you are not receiving Communion, you are welcome to receive a Blessing: to do so, kneel and cross your arms over your chest.

A Brief History of St. John's Church in Savannah

Founded in 1841, the first rector, Stephen Elliott, was also the first bishop of Georgia, and he consecrated the present church on May 7th 1853. In 1943, one of Savannah's historic mansions, the Green-Meldrim House, became its Parish House and Rectory. Later, Macon Street in the block between the church and Green-Meldrim House was closed and laid out as the present garden Mall. Cranmer Hall, the Christian Education building, was renovated and enlarged in 2004. St. John's is one of a handful of parishes in the Episcopal Church that continues to worship using the classical Book of Common Prayer (in its 1928 edition). We are committed to transmitting unimpaired to our posterity the historic Faith and Order it sets forth, within the fellowship of the Anglican Communion.

How we Worship and Why: Divine Service

Worship is a two-way street. We speak to God in praise and prayer - but we also listen to him. "Hear, O my people, and I will speak" (Ps. 50:7). God speaks to us through the liturgy, and especially in a richly Biblical liturgy like the old Prayer Book. He speaks to us through its set forms (like the Absolution, or Blessing) and through passages that are read from the Bible (not only the Epistle and Gospel lessons for each Sunday and feast day, but also the Law, Offertory sentence, the Comfortable Words, and the words of Christ over the elements in the Lord's Supper). God also speaks to us through sermons. Not everyone likes sermons, but if the preacher knows his business, his discourse is a word from God to us; one that takes a teaching of the Bible, opens it to our understanding (so that we grasp its full meaning and implications), applies it to our particular circumstances, and moves us to embrace its challenge and promise. If a preacher knows his business, the Word of God is an arrow to the heart. That's not something most Christians can easily do for ourselves (though reading sermons, or other books of sound Christian teaching, can sometimes come close.) Not every sermon does this, of course even champion athletes have bad days, and not every preacher is a champion - but that's no reason to dismiss preaching. Whether or not we like sermons, they are indispensable to worship. Because worship is not a monologue. "Today, if ye will hear his voice, harden not your hearts" (Psalm 95:8).



PARISH PAPER ESSAY

SEEKING GOD'S KINGDOM (2)

The last two Sundays (Trinity 14 and 15) have set before us a choice - to live by the Flesh, in self-gratifying greed, or to live by the Spirit, in grateful service; to live by fear, in the service of Mammon, or by faith, in the service of God; in godless anxiety, or in godly ambition. When we live by faith in God's fatherly goodness, we are set free to "seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness", in the confidence that his providence will not fail us. That is our Stewardship theme: "Seeking God's kingdom, for ourselves, our church, and our neighbor".

But what is "God's kingdom"? We may think of a "kingdom" as a territory ruled by a king, and of God's kingdom as a place in the clouds. But in the Bible a kingdom is not a place but a power; it is kingship in action: it's what a king does. He saves and defends his people from their enemies. He upholds justice by his judgments. He preserves their possession of the land that is their inheritance. So the kingdom of God is not a remote place in heaven, but a present activity of God here on earth. The good news of the gospel is that God's kingdom is coming, "on earth as it is in heaven", and is already come in the words, works, and person of Jesus. In his works of power ("miracles"), we see the power of God's kingdom to save an afflicted people from defilement, disease, demon-possession, and death. In his acts of judgment, we see the power of God's kingdom to establish justice among men, by forgiving sins, reconciling sinners, putting down the mighty from their seats and exalting the humble and meek. In bestowing on his people the Spirit, we see the power of his Kingdom to impart an inheritance better than land - the gift of God himself, who in taking his people as his possession, gives himself to be theirs: "My beloved is mine, and I am his".

But who is this people that he saves and blesses? It is a community constituted by the faithful response to the gospel proclamation of the Kingdom. True, the gospel meets with rejection as well as reception;

but in the cross and resurrection the Kingdom triumphs. For there the King takes upon himself the death our sins deserve, that he may give us the life that only his righteousness deserves, and so he wins to himself a people gathered out of all sorts and conditions of men, to be his witness among all nations. That witness is necessary, because the consummation of the Kingdom - when "the kingdoms of this world are become the kingdoms of our Lord, and of his Christ" (Rev. 11:15) - is not yet. So the Kingdom is present, but hidden, proclaimed by the witness of our words and works, yet known by faith alone. Grounded in grateful memory of its first coming, we look with expectant hope for its final revelation. Until that day, grateful hope informs all that we do, and all that we suffer; for it is the coming of God's kingdom that everything we do or suffer is rescued from futility. It is the one thing - the "pearl of great price" - for whose sake all other things are worth doing or suffering. "Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye steadfast, immoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord; forasmuch as ye know that your labour is not in vain in the Lord".

In summary, that is what we mean by God's kingdom. Like any summary it is both abstract and general, nebulous and vague. In the pages of the New Testament, however, we see it fleshed out in life. In this Sunday's gospel (Luke 7:11-17), we see what the Kingdom's coming means for a widow on her way to bury her only son, and what it means for her friends and neighbours, and what it means for the people who hear the news of what happened. Such is the dynamism of God's Kingdom: it creates an ever-widening community of praise which cannot be contained, but overflows, until its glory fills the earth. Drawn into that community of praise, we too have been invited to seek first God's kingdom, and to flesh out what it means for ourselves, our church, and our neighbours is what we will be considering in the next few weeks.
