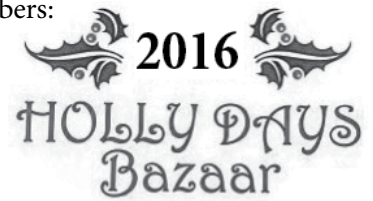



******Holly Days Bazaar CHILI******

2 pounds of Ground Beef

2 teaspoons Salt

1 medium Onion, minced

2 teaspoons Black Pepper

2 Green Peppers, minced

32 ounces of Whole Tomatoes, with juice

4 tablespoons Chili Powder

16 ounces Tomato Sauce

2 teaspoons Ground Cumin

32 ounces Red Kidney Beans OR Black Beans, with juice

Brown ground beef in large pot, drain off fat. Add remaining ingredients to beef and cook over low heat for an hour...or more. STIR OFTEN to prevent scalding at bottom of the pot.

Place pot of Chili in sink, surround with ice, stirring occasional until Chili is room temperature. Can be double-bagged in regular ziplocks for your freezer. IF freezing on a rack, be sure to place a piece of cardboard or folded newspaper between rack and Chili bags to prevent chili freezing into freezer rack.

******Holly Days Bazaar VEGETABLE SOUP******

2 pounds of Ground Beef

2 teaspoons Salt

1 medium Onion, minced

2 teaspoons Black Pepper

2 Green Peppers, minced

32 ounces of Diced Tomatoes

1 Zucchini, diced

3 stalks celery, diced

2 Bay Leaves

3 cups beef broth

6 cups water

Frozen vegetables such as mixed veggies, green beans, lima beans, corn
(pick 3)

Brown ground beef in large pot; drain off fat. Add peppers, onions, zucchini and celery and cook 5-10 minutes. Add remaining ingredients and cook over low heat for an hour...or more. STIR OFTEN to prevent scalding at bottom of the pot. REMOVE bay leaves.

Place pot of soup in sink, surround with ice, stirring occasionally until soup is room temperature. Can be double-bagged in regular ziplocks for your freezer. IF freezing on a rack, be sure to place a piece of cardboard or folded newspaper between rack and Chili bags to prevent chili freezing into freezer rack.

Green-Meldrim House and Green Furniture News

Continuing our efforts to make a wider audience aware of the Green-Meldrim House--hopefully resulting in increased revenues from visitors--our Green Collection Curator Tania Sammons spoke about our new Green furniture acquisitions, the house, and St. John's Church at the Southeastern Museums Conference (SEMC) in Charlotte, North Carolina, on October 11. Ms. Sammons shared stories about our active house, which brings people together in fellowship, history, and architecture in her presentation, "Dual Missions: Church Parish and House Museum: Tales from the Green-Meldrim House." With over 600 attendees, this annual meeting provided wonderful exposure for us as SEMC is the major regional networking organization for museums and their staff in the southeastern United States.

In addition, increased interest in the Green-Meldrim House and our newly-acquired Green furniture is bringing a distinguished group to visit us this month. On October 29, Ms. Sammons will lead the Georgia Museum of Art's Henry D. Green Decorative Arts Advisory Committee on a tour of the Green-Meldrim House. This important Committee advises the museum's Henry D. Green Center of the Decorative Arts, which supports research and provides educational opportunities, such as their biennial symposia on Georgia-related decorative arts. Given their primary focus on works made in or of significance to Georgia, the Committee is especially excited to learn more about the Green-Meldrim House and our new Green family collection.

Congratulations to Ms. Sammons on a productive start to her work with us, and many thanks for her advice in getting our historic house prepared for Hurricane Matthew!
