OLD FRIENDS & NEWCOMERS

This weekend past a meeting of the Prayer Book Society board took me to All Souls, Oklahoma City, where I had the pleasure of a visit with our friends, Fr Patrick Bright and his wife Rhea. With a cold-blooded eye on the main chance that would do credit to an Okie oil-baron, Patrick had me conduct a Saturday morning seminar on the Eucharist, preach at his four principal services, and speak to his adult forum. Even now I am plotting revenge.

By their attachment to the Church's tradition, churches like St. John's or All Souls can find themselves on the institutional margins. Nonetheless, precisely because of this attachment, they can also flourish, holding on to a core of long-term members, and attracting new ones, often from other Christian churches. Paradoxically, it is sometimes the newcomers who take the Church's tradition more seriously and seek to live it out more fully than those for whom it has become routine. Welcoming, educating, and making space for these new members is an important task for the congregation: a task that requires a conversion of our own hearts. GGD

SPRING-TRAINING II

This Sunday is Sexagesima, the eighth before Easter and the second before Lent, whose teaching prepares us for the disciplines of that season of spiritual spring-training. Today we consider the

virtue of Christian Hope, as a goal of our spring-training. In the Old Testament (Genesis 6:5-end), Noah's obedience to God's commands is a model of Hope established not in the world's false promise, but in the saving promise of God. In the epistle lesson (2nd Corinthians 11:19-12:9), Paul's endurance of sufferings for the sake of the gospel is a model of Hope founded not in his own strength or achievement, but in the power of God. The gospel lesson (St. Luke 8:4-15), the parable of the Sower who went out to sow his seed, teaches us to hear and receive the Word of God in Hope, patiently enduring and confidently waiting for its fruition. The hope in which Lenten disciplines train us is founded upon the Promises of God (Genesis), directed to the Power of God (Epistle), and expressed in Patient expectation of God (Gospel).

If Faith is exercised in the *fasting* and *abstinence* of those who hungrily hear the word of God, Hope is exercised in the *prayer* of those who are hungry for the grace promised by God. Thus fasting is accompanied by prayer, in which we learn to hope in God, in his power to fulfill his promises set forth in his word.

During Lent, therefore, I would encourage you will plan to join the Church at least once a week in its

WAY OF THE CROSS

For centuries Christians have gone on pilgrimage to Jerusalem, to visit the holy places where Jesus fulfilled and accomplished the will of God for our salvation, by his death and resurrection. Such pilgrims continued to practice the "way of the cross" after they came home, embracing the Cross of our Savior in repentance, faith, and love. In the version we use on Good Friday at 5:30 p.m. – one devised by Pope John Paul II and more closely aligned to the Biblical text than the one customarily used - there are fourteen "stations" (stopping places) along the way of the cross, at each of which we remember with gratitude and repentance what Jesus did and suffered for our salvation.

On every Sunday until Easter, after their assembly and before class, the Sunday School children will learn about one or two of the Stations of the Way of the Cross. On Palm Sunday, all the stations in order will be reviewed and completed, as the children make their own prayer booklets. Then on Good Friday at 5:30 p.m. the youth of St. John's will lead families and other parishioners in a Way of the Cross that begins in Pulaski Square and concludes in the Church. Parents and grandparents, please take note!
