EVIL THOUGHTS (II)

Last week we began to look at the canonical list of the “seven deadly sins” formulated by the ancient Church and central to Dante’s masterpiece of the moral theology, the *Purgatorio*. A triad of loves perverted, Pride, Envy, Anger, led to the defective love of Accidie or Sloth. Now we consider a triad of loves excessive: avarice, lust, and gluttony.

Avarice, or Covetousness, is an inordinate love of material goods, and especially money. The problem with avarice is that it serves money as a kind of false god. “Ye cannot serve God and Mammon”. “Having food and raiment let us therewith be content” advises the Apostle, “for the love of money is the root of all evil” (I Timothy 6:8, 10): “Charge them that are rich in this world, that they be not highminded [haughty], nor trust in uncertain riches, but in this living God, who giveth us richly all things to enjoy; that they do good, that they be rich in good works, ready to distribute, willing to communicate...” (6:17-18). As this text

and others show, avarice is opposed by *Liberality*: “Let him that stole, steal no more: but rather let him labour with his hands the thing that is good, that he may have to give to them that needeth” (Ephesians 4:28). Covet righteousness rather than riches: “Blessed are those who thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled”.

Lust is inordinate love of sexual pleasure. In our time the culture has invested vast energies in legitimizing recreational sex, and so it is necessary to affirm that sexual pleasures have their proper place within the loving and faithful union of a man and a woman in marriage and not outside it. “For this is the will of God, even your sanctification, that ye should abstain from fornication: that every one of you should know how to possess his vessel in sanctification and honour; not in the lust of concupiscence, even as the Gentiles which know not God... For God hath not called us to uncleanness, but unto holiness” (1 Thess. 4:3-5, 7). Inordinate desire for sexual gratification

PLEASE REMEMBER YOUR CHURCH IN YOUR WILL

is a kind of “covetousness”, and amounts to “idolatry” (Colossians 3:5). Because the sexual instinct is so strong, the best defense against temptation is custody of the eyes, and, in time of temptation, flight. If you cannot resist helping yourself to cookies, then stay away from the cookie jar! Its contrary virtue is *chastity* (as regards the sexual act itself) and *purity* (in embraces and all that may lead to the sexual act). “Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God”.

Gluttony (Gula, an evocative word!) is the perversion of the natural delight in food and drink, and is not to be identified with joyful exuberance! The Feast and the Fast both belong to the temperate soul. Gluttony may take the form of desire excessive as regards quantity *or* quality. Though eating sparingly, the foodie and the fussy may also be in danger of gluttony. While gluttony may seem tame compared to envy or pride, it destroys the spiritual life by directing the entire world of the soul to sensual pleasure. And it contributes to grave disorders – of bingeing and purging, of overeating, drunkenness, and recreational drug use: “whose end is destruction, whose God is their belly, whose glory is in their shame, who mind earthly things” (Philippians 3:19). Gluttony is opposed by *Temperance* (or *Moderation*), a kind of “self-less self-preservation” which defends and preserves the inner order of the soul against the distortions of compulsive greed. “Blessed are those who hunger and thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled”.

Knowledge of the seven capital sins and their contrary virtues is part of the Christian’s armour in the spiritual warfare against sin, the world, and the devil. It is a part of the knowledge of God and the soul (the self), that is learned by hearing, reading and ‘inwardly digesting’, in meditative recollection and reflection, the Word of God in Holy Scripture. Such knowledge

becomes *self*-knowledge when applied in the examination of conscience, and that naturally leads to repentance in thought (contrition, or sorrow for sin), word (confession), and deed (satisfaction, or reparation). Such repentance is futile unless it leads to amendment of life – the breaking down of habits of vice and the cultivation of virtues, with the help of fasting, prayer, and alms-giving. The soul from which a demon has been expelled must not be left empty, ‘swept and garnished’, lest the demon return with ‘seven other spirits more wicked than himself, and the last state of that man is worse than the first’. Only new habits of virtue can prevent us from relapsing disastrously into old habits of vice.

It is easy to talk about such things, much harder to do them. When we fail, we are tempted to despair; and when we succeed, we are tempted to pride. The cure for despair is the prayer of hope in God. The cure for pride is humble thanksgiving: giving all the glory of victory to God. Moral renewal requires effort: but it is only possible if it begins in the free gift of God’s grace, received in faith. The practice of prayer and thanksgiving are thus the beginning and end of all our moral disciplines. GGD
