FATHERING (PART 2)

Last week I wrote about the critical importance of fathering to the moral formation of individuals. Absent, abusive, or uninvolved fathering engenders morally and socially dysfunctional children; but where men take responsible, gracious leadership (“fathering”) in the family, women and children both benefit. This is true not just of the family, but also of other institutions in society, the church, schools, healthcare, business, and politics. Yet such fathering is not innate: it is a learned behaviour, the product of culture. And since culture is religion externalized (culture comes from *cultus*, worship), it is

to religious belief that we look for the inculturation of a fatherly mind in men.

The religious traditions encountered by ancient Jews and Christians in Mesopotamia, Syria, Egypt, and Greece, were rich in “father gods” – all too often dysfunctional in one way or another, inept and weak or abusive tyrants – a critique which the Greek philosophers also made. In the God who spoke by the prophets of Israel, and supremely by his Son, they encountered a new kind of fatherhood. Though the Old Testament rarely refers to the God of Israel in explicitly fatherly terms (cf. Dt. 32:7; Is. 63:16, 64:8), Jesus’ understanding of the Scriptures is never more accurate than in his constant identification of the God of Israel as “the Father”, in relation to whom he was “the Son” and sole mediator of God and men. It is in the Father we know in his Son, Jesus Christ, that we know fatherhood.

He is emphatically the one Father, not one among many. There is no chaos of warring principles, but a consistent, unified principle by which all things are ruled and governed. He is both just and compassionate: ready and able to save and deliver his people from their enemies, and to bring them into a land of milk and honey; giving them a law to unify their souls and society in relation to the good; holding them to account for their rebellions, chastising them when they go wrong, yet also ready to forgive: “merciful and gracious, long-suffering, and abundant in goodness and truth” (Exodus 34:6).

It is in their relation to this God, moreover, that the importance and dignity of human fathers is revealed; for, says the Second Commandment, he is a “jealous God ... visiting the sins of the fathers upon the children, unto the third and fourth generation of them that hate me; and showing mercy unto thousands [of generations] in them that love me and keep my commandments”. This needs to be read through the teaching of Ezekiel 18:20 (“the soul that sinneth, it shall die”), but what it says can be verified by experience. Fathers

transmit their own relation to God – to the law and to the gospel - to their children, and though children may break with that inheritance (for good or ill), it is in the decisions of fathers – of loyalty to the divine fatherhood or in rejection of it – that the spiritual and moral outlook of their children is forged. Human fatherhood is not inconsequential, and the full measure of its consequentiality is seen in its relation to the divine fatherhood. GGD
