WHOSE PROFIT?

The epistle lesson for the 10th Sunday after Trinity (1 Corinthians 12:1-11) speaks of the diverse gifts which the Spirit has distributed to "every man to profit withal". The phrase raises the question, *whose profit?* The individual, or, as many writers ancient and modern take it, "the common good"? Though the former is not excluded, the context strongly favours the latter. These are gifts of *service*. Just a chapter before, the Apostle had spoken of "not seeking mine own profit, but the profit of many, that many be saved" (10:33). Likewise a chapter later he exhorts those who are "zealous of spiritual gifts, seek ye that ye may excel to the edifying of the church" (14:12) – for building up the congregation. Thus the fourth century Doctor of the Church St. Basil the Great advises his monastic community on the basis of this passage: "Since no one has the capacity to receive all spiritual gifts, but the grace of the Spirit is given proportionately to the faith of each, when one is living in community with others, the grace privately bestowed on each individual becomes the common possession of the others....One who receives any of these gifts does not possess it for his own sake but rather for the sake of others" (*The Long Rules*, 7).

In his *Sermons on the Creed*, St. Thomas Aquinas puts it this way: "as in our natural body the operation of one member works for the good of the entire body, so also is it with a spiritual body, such as is the Church. Because all the

faithful are one body, the good of one member is communicated to another.... Among the various members of the Church, the principal member is Christ, because he is the Head. ...we know that not only the efficacy of Christ's Passion is communicated to us, but also the merits of his life; and, moreover, all that good that all the saints have done is communicated to all who are in the state of grace, because all are one. ...Therefore, he who lives in charity participates in all the good that is done in the entire world.... Thus through this communion we receive two benefits. One is that the merits of Christ are communicated to all; the other is that the good of one is communicated to another."

This doctrine – the Communion of Saints – and its practical implications are concisely spelled out in the 1560 Heidelberg Catechism, one of the great teaching vehicles of the Reformers on the continent and in England: "*Question*. What do you understand by the communion of saints? *Answer*: First, that all and everyone who believes, being members of Christ, are in common partakers of him, and of all his riches and gifts; and secondly, that everyone must know it to be his duty, readily and cheerfully to employ his gifts for the advantage and salvation of other members."

PLEASE REMEMBER YOUR CHURCH IN YOUR WILL

Alexander Nowell, the Dean of St. Paul's, is commonly remembered as the preacher whose sermon touching on matters of public policy was interrupted by Queen Elizabeth, "To your text, Mr. Dean, to your text!". He is also notable as the author of a Longer Catechism in which he has this comment on "the communion of saints": "... though they be severed and sundered by divers and far distant times and places, in what nation soever, or in what land so ever they be, [Christians] are yet members most nearly conjoined and knit together, of one and of the selfsame body, whereof Christ is the head.... For they are most nearly knit together in community of spirit, of faith, of sacraments, of prayers, of forgiveness of sins, of eternal felicity, and, finally, of all the benefits which God giveth his Church through Christ. Yea, they are so joined together with most strait bonds of concord and love, they have so all one mind, that the profit of any one and of them all is all one; and to this endeavour they do most bend themselves, how they may with interchange of beneficial doings, with counsel and help, further each other in all things, and specially to attaining of that blessed and eternal life."

The supreme truth and the highest good can be possessed only in the diversity of gifts within the shared life of a community, in the commerce and exchange that unites individuals in one body. In the unity of the Spirit what is given to one becomes the common possession of all; and what is done by one benefits and profits all, through the charity that "seeketh not her own" (1 Corinthians 13:5). This is the core of the doctrine confessed in the Apostles' Creed as an Article of Faith, the "communion of saints". We are, as St. Paul says, "called to be saints". As we are called, so may we follow. GGD
