CONSECRATION SUNDAY IS COMING: OCTOBER 30TH

FROM THE SENIOR WARDEN

Giving to one's church is a personal matter, but one grounded in biblical teaching. Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes.

This October the Vestry's Stewardship Committee will follow the *New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program* (slightly adjusted to conform to the customs of our parish) as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education.

Consecration Sunday is based on the biblical teaching of the need of the giver to give for his own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating our Parishioners as members of a social club who should pay dues, we ask them to be followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. *Consecration Sunday* encourages people towards proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?" During Holy Communion or Morning Prayer on Consecration Sunday, we are asking our parishioners to make their financial commitments to our church's mission and

ministry.

Every parishioner who completes an *Estimate of Giving Card* does so voluntarily while attending services at 8 a. m. or 10:30 a. m. on Consecration Sunday, October 30. (There will be no service at Noon.) If you are strongly opposed to completing a card we urge you to attend one of the services and the Brunch (after the 8 a.m. service) or the Luncheon (after the 10:30 a.m. service). The process is done in such a way that no one should feel uncomfortable if he chooses not to fill out an Estimate of Giving card during the service. There will be no home solicitation to ask people to complete Estimate of Giving cards. This year's "guest preacher", Fr Dunbar, will conduct a brief period of instruction and exhortation, culminating in members' making their commitments as a confidential act of worship.

We will encourage participation in Consecration Sunday events through the Stewardship Committee and our Vestry members. Since we will make no follow-up visits to ask people to complete their cards, we will make every effort to inform and encourage everyone to attend a service on Consecration Sunday, October 30.

OFFERING AND COMMUNION

When James, Peter and John extended the "right hand of fellowship" to Paul and Barnabas, and agreed that they go to preach the Gospel of Israel's Messiah among the godless Gentiles they made one condition only: "that we should remember the poor" (Galatians 2:10), by which they meant the poor in the churches of Judea, who had been reduced to misery by a severe famine (cf. Acts 11:29, 30); "the same which I also was forward to do", Paul adds. The apostolic church understood that almsgiving was the practical counterpart of the gospel they preached and believed, and the sharing of goods by prosperous Christians with poor Christians - not just locally, but globally - was an important expression of the communion and fellowship into which Christ had received them all, Jews and Gentiles, rich and poor, near and far. I give thanks therefore that this past Sunday the congregation offered \$1654.15 to our Anglican partners in the Global South through the *Anglican Relief and Development Fund*. By happy coincidence our own Fund "*For the Least of These My Brethren*" received a gift of \$2000 designated for the sisters of St. Mary in Malawi (one of the poorest countries in Africa), with whom we have had a partnership since Fr Ralston's time. By such gifts do we testify to our gratitude for the grace we have received through Christ, and which we share with all Christians throughout the world. If you would like to contribute to either fund please indicate in the memo line of a cheque made out to St. John's Church.
