## CHRISTMAS COMMUNION

*The three principal feasts of the Church's year are Christmas, Easter, and Whitsunday; and for their souls' health, all baptized and communicant members are encouraged to receive -with repentance, faith, and charity - the Sacrament of Holy Communion on these days or as soon as possible afterwards. For Christmas these days are: Christmas Eve or Christmas Day, the feasts of St. Stephen, St. John, and Holy Innocents (the Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday after Christmas), or the Octave Day of Christmas, Sunday January 1<sup>st</sup>. If unable to attend public worship by reason of health, please consult the clergy. See page 3 for service times.*
