#### WELCOME TO ST. JOHN'S

**Mission.** St. John's Church is building a community in Christ that is grounded in historic faith and reverent worship and is committed to sharing the life-transforming truth of the Gospel.

Worship Schedule. Our non-holiday Sunday schedule is: 8 a.m. Holy Communion in the church; 9 a.m. Family Worship Service (Family Morning Prayer in the church on the first, second, third, and fifth Sundays of the month and Holy Communion in the chapel on the fourth Sundays); and 11 a.m. Holy Communion in the church on the first, third, and fifth Sundays of the month with Morning Prayer on the second and fourth Sundays. Children's Nursery. The nursery is available in Cranmer Hall from 8:45 a.m. to 12:15 p.m.

**Interactive Worship.** The congregation participates actively in worship, and this booklet is a guide to taking part in it. It is based on the **1940 Hymnal**, and the smaller **1928 Prayer Book**.

#### A Brief History of St. John's Church in Savannah

Founded in 1841, the first rector, Stephen Elliott, who was also the first bishop of Georgia, consecrated the present church on May 7, 1853. In 1943, the Green-Meldrim House, became its Parish House and Rectory. Later, Macon Street in the block between the church and Green-Meldrim House was closed and laid out as the present garden Mall. Cranmer Hall, the Christian Education building, was renovated and enlarged in 2004. St. John's is one of a handful of parishes in the Episcopal Church that continues to worship using the classical Book of Common Prayer (in its 1928 edition). We are committed to transmitting to our posterity the historic Faith and Order it sets forth, within the fellowship of the Anglican Communion.

#### HOW WE WORSHIP AND WHY - CONTRITION

At the beginning of the day of worship the Psalmist exhorts us, "Today, if you would hear his voice, harden not your hearts"; and the Prayer Book is designed to soften our hearts and make them malleable to the transforming action of the Spirit. After the Law of God is rehearsed, for instance, we pray not only for mercy on our transgressions, but that he would "incline our hearts to keep this law", and to "write all these thy laws in our hearts", in accordance with the promises of the new testament (Jeremiah 31:31-34). But it is especially in the General Confessions of sin that we humble ourselves beneath God's hand. Repentance requires *confession* (an acknowledgement by the intellect of the wrong we have done), but it also requires *contrition* (an aversion of the will from the wrong we have done). If we are holding onto the thing we have acknowledged as wrong, we are in deep trouble indeed! *The sacrifice of God is a troubled spirit: a broken and contrite heart, O God, shalt thou not despise* (Psalm 51:7, cf Isaiah 57:15; 66:2). We must not only acknowledge the sins "which we ... most grievously have committed" – their very "remembrance" must also be "grievous *unto us*". Yet in the demand for contrition we are confronted by the hardness of our hearts, its bondage to the idols of our imagination, the false gods of pleasure and power to which we look for meaning, purpose, life, salvation. That's why, when in the Confession or the *Agnus Dei* we strike our breast three times with our right fist, "it is", as Guardini put it, "to beat against the doors of our inner world in order to shatter them".


