A Brief History of St. John's Church in Savannah

Founded in 1841, the first rector, Stephen Elliott, was also the first bishop of Georgia, and he consecrated the present church on May 7, 1853. In 1943, one of Savannah's historic mansions, the Green-Meldrim House, became its Parish House and Rectory. Later, Macon Street in the block between the church and Green-Meldrim House was closed and laid out as the present garden Mall. Cranmer Hall, the Christian Education building, was renovated and enlarged in 2004. St. John's is one of a handful of parishes in the Episcopal Church that continues to worship using the classical Book of Common Prayer (in its 1928 edition). We are committed to transmitting unimpaired to our posterity the historic Faith and Order it sets forth, within the fellowship of the Anglican Communion.

HOW WE WORSHIP AND WHY - THREE BIRTHDAYS

Everyone knows that Christmas is "Jesus' birthday". What they may not realize is that Christians celebrate not just one, but *three* "birthdays" on the feast of Christmas. For the child who is wonderfully born to the virgin Mary is the Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, outside time and space, but now begotten in time and space. That's two birthdays, one in time and one outside of time. The infinite God enters finitude, and is incarnate, clothed with flesh. He takes upon himself a complete human nature like ours, body and soul alike, except for sin. And he does so, that clothed in that same human nature, he might suffer, die, rise again, and ascend, still clothed in our humanity, into heaven. He comes down from heaven to meet us in our need, that he may exalt us to the right hand of the Father. The Son of God has become the Son of Man, so that the sons of men might become the sons of God. And so the third "birthday" we celebrate is our own: our own regeneration or rebirth by the Spirit, that we may be made the children of God by adoption and grace, that in Christ we too may know God as Father and rejoice in his changeless good will toward us. "O Holy Child of Bethlehem, descend to us we pray: cast out our sin and enter in, be born in us today".
