# HOW WE WORSHIP AND WHY - FACING EAST IN PRAYER

Muslims (it's well known) face Mecca when they pray: what's not well known, is that this was an adaptation of the ancient Christian custom, of facing east when they prayed. Facing east to pray is called "orientation" – literally, facing the direction of the rising (in Latin, oriens) sun, that is, the east. For centuries many churches (where the site permits) were "oriented" – the chief liturgical center (the altar) lies at the east end of the building. And likewise, the priest at the altar faces east to address the Lord in prayer and praise, and at key moments (such as the Creed) the congregation does also. At St. John's the main entrance is at the east, and the altar is at the west; but for the purposes of liturgical symbolism, the altar serves as "liturgical east". So what is the meaning of orientation? It's this: that in Scripture the coming of God to save and bless his people is described in the imagery of the sun's rising: "unto you that fear my name shall the Sun of righteousness arise with healing in his wings" (Malachi 4:2). In the coming of the Messiah Zacharias proclaims that the "dayspring [dawn] from on high hath visited us, to give light to them that sit in darkness, and to guide our feet into the way of peace" (Luke 1:78, 79). The women come to the tomb early, at the rising of the sun – but the Son is already risen. And we who believe in Christ, look with hope for his coming now in grace, and his future coming in glory: "the night is far spent, the day is at hand" (Romans 13:12). In the facing east to pray, we express the fundamental orientation of our souls to Christ, and to the breaking of God's new day of salvation.

#### Receiving the Sacrament.

Those who are baptized, have attained to years of discretion, and who have been admitted to communion (which at St. John's, is normally by confirmation, but for visitors may have taken place by some other means) are welcome to receive the sacrament. All others are welcome to receive a blessing at the altar rail (please kneel and cross arms over your breast to signify your intention).

To receive the host, please place right hand over left, palm up, at the level of your chest, and lift the host to your lips. To receive the chalice, keep your neck and head straight, and lightly grasp the bowl or stem of the chalice to guide it to your lips. For reasons of hygiene, self-intinction (dipping) of the host in the chalice is not permitted. If you do not wish to receive the chalice, you may get up after receiving the host, or cross your arms over your chest.

## PARISH PAPER ESSAY

## LORD OF THE STORM (Revised and reprinted from 2017)

As I write, we are expecting a brush with a tropical depression: no surprise for us at this time of year, and we know what to expect and how to get ready for it. Does God have a place in our preparations? Even Christians today are not even looking for him in the storm: we think the meteorologists tell us all we need to know. What difference can it make to attend to God's role in this? Yet it's not accidental that the Bible applies the imagery of the storm to the Lord – imagery of unmastered power, before which man is humbled. For God is the Almighty Lord; he is infinite power, sovereign freedom, and "he hath done whatsoever pleased him". We may no more control him than we can bridle a hurricane.

This storm-imagery must be used with care. Pagans might think that Zeus *was* the storm; but in the Scriptural account, God is infinitely greater than any storm, and is not to be confused with it. He is not (as pagans and atheists assume) something within the world of space and time, like a storm, only bigger; something that both acts and is acted upon by other things in the world - but a supreme power *over* the world, utterly free to act as he wills *in* the world. And though he be as untamable as a storm, unlike a storm what he wills is *good.* "We know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose" (Romans 8:28) – "all things", even, or perhaps especially, those least promising to our eyes. That's why we can trust him even as the sea rages.

Do you see what a difference this makes to those who believe? Pagans think of the storm as a god, and atheists think of it as meteorology, yet both can only regard the storm with fatalism. You can try to appease the gods, you can try to predict the storm track, but if neither tactic works, all you can hope for is to escape being crushed by its wrath. But Christians, at least those who understand their religion, will regard the storm in a very different light - one that takes fuller account of reality. Unlike the pagans, they will not think the storm is a god, but rather as the result of natural forces, precisely because they know the world and everything in it to be the creation of divine reason, operating by laws which human reason can discover. Unlike the atheists, however, they will recognize that meteorology alone does not explain the meaning of history. Though the created order has a certain autonomy granted it by the Creator, yet even so it is governed by a providence that is infinite in power, wisdom, and goodness, and acts within the finite to fulfill its own great design. When the storm strikes, therefore, we will not respond with fatalism. We will perceive the visitation of God's judgment, that humbles our pride; when we escape its fury, we shall perceive his mercy, and give thanks "not only with our lips but with our lives"; if and when we suffer calamity, we will not lose hope: a God that is infinite in wisdom and goodness as well as in power sees a much bigger picture than finite human minds possibly see, and "is able to do exceeding abundantly above all that we ask or think" (Eph. 3:20). We may not see his reasons for this storm, but that does not mean he does not have them. So today, before the memory recedes, behold the Lord of the storm in the storm; give thanks for his visitation, and declare his loving-kindness, by whose mighty protection you have been preserved. 
