#### A Brief History of St. John's Church in Savannah

Founded in 1841, the first rector, Stephen Elliott, was also the first bishop of Georgia, and he consecrated the present church on May 7, 1853. In 1943, one of Savannah's historic mansions, the Green-Meldrim House, became its Parish House and Rectory. Later, Macon Street in the block between the church and Green-Meldrim House was closed and laid out as the present garden Mall. Cranmer Hall, the Christian Education building, was renovated and enlarged in 2004. St. John's is one of a handful of parishes in the Episcopal Church that continues to worship using the classical Book of Common Prayer (in its 1928 edition). We are committed to transmitting unimpaired to our posterity the historic Faith and Order it sets forth, within the fellowship of the Anglican Communion.

#### HOW WE WORSHIP AND WHY-THE SOLEMNITY OF CHRISTMAS

Solemnity, in modern dictionaries, means "grave" or "serious": a solemn face is the one you wear to hear bad news and to funerals. But what the word originally meant was something grand, stately, splendid, and magnificent. A solemnity is an event of great dignity, and of great delight, an occasion of reverent rejoicing, a feast! That's still the meaning of the word when we speak of a "Solemn Eucharist" – it is a service in which music, vestments, ceremonial (including incense) aspires to a dignified delight. It is a service in which we attempt to respond both inwardly and outwardly in a fashion that corresponds, so far as we are able, to the greatness of the thing which we celebrate. And what is greater than that God himself is incarnate, and born of the virgin? What more awesomely great, than that the infinite God has made himself at home in our finitude, the almighty maker of the world wrapped in swaddling bands and laid in a manger? What more awesome than that the Son of God has become Son of Man, so that the sons of men might become the sons of God? His birth moved the angels to sing "Glory be to God on high", and we cannot do less, in our churches and in our homes, to keep the feast of Christmas with the most solemnity we can muster!

The Last Gospel: St. John 1:1-14 (All stand)

*Minister*: The beginning of the Holy ★ Gospel according to St. John.
