THE PARISH HOUSE AT EIGHTY Last Friday there was an octogesimal celebration in our Parish House, commemorating its purchase by St. John's eighty years ago. In the middle of the Second World War, and on the heels of the Great Depression, the purchase of Savannah's premier antebellum mansion qualifies as a visionary act. The rector in 1943, Ernest Risley (Mr. Risley, as everyone called him), was the man to make it happen - he also acquired for St. John's the garden mall, the parking lot, and the first form of Cranmer Hall. In response to his pulpit challenge the money was raised in six weeks, a little over forty-one thousand dollars, much of it in small contributions (one of \$2500, four of \$1000, the rest \$500 or much less). A list of the five hundred and forty six contributors (from inside and outside the parish) survives, and it includes names of persons (Sam and Lilla Varnedoe, Mrs Malcolm Maclean, Charles Ellis, Raymond Demere) and businesses (Globe Shoes, Smith Brothers, Fine's Department Store, the Leopold Adler Company, Derst Baking Company, the DeSoto Hotel) still known today, as well as a donor identified as "Little French Woman" and the "Choir Boys" (\$1.60).

Right from the beginning, this purchase of the Green-Meldrim House by St. John's Church was regarded as an civic act of historic preservation. "With fire in his eyes", according to the newspaper account, Mr. Risley said that it "had to be saved". A public appeal was published in support of the purchase, written by Walter Hartridge

Preservation of Savannah Landmarks. Historic preservation in Savannah is conventionally dated to 1955, when revival style, known to have been in the Davenport House was rescued from demolition, but the preservation of the Green-Meldrim House preceded it by twelve years.

The result of that purchase in 1943 is that the House has now been longer in the stewardship of St. John's than either its previous owners, and has long been a much-loved focus of congregational life. In the 1950's and 60's, when it housed the Sunday School, it was furnished in "early attic" and endured heavy usage: latterly, in the rectorship of Fr. Ralston, it was furnished with period antiques by Mrs. Effie Denney and Mrs. Susan Patterson, to become a gracious setting for bridal dressing, wedding and funeral receptions, Sunday coffee hour, and public tours.

House, and we also want to share its historic heritage more fully with the world; and to that end this year we also set up a new charitable entity, the Keepers of the Historic Green-Meldrim House, to manage the house on behalf of St. John's, which retains ownership and has a majority voice on the Board. This year we also had the opportunity to appoint Jamie Credle, a much-respected former director of the Davenport House, as the first Director of the Green-Meldrim House. Under the direction of Mrs. Credle and the House will remain an important venue new board (ably chaired by Sherry Holtzclaw), the last six months have been a whirlwind of activity, with the expansion of the docent team (including a program for high school students), and an overdue reconfiguration of the historic furnishings on the second floor.

Unlike many historic houses. the Green-Meldrim House has an amazingly large collection of original furnishings, from both families. At

at the behest of the Society for the last Friday's celebration, two further acquisitions were unveiled, a pair of rosewood side chairs in Rococo the House during the Meldrim years, the gift of a Meldrim descendant, Mr. Andrew Jones, whose refurbishment was made possible in part by the gift of another Meldrim descendant and his wife, Mr. and Mrs. Tim Coy. Also with us last Friday was Mrs. Anna Habersham Smith, whose contributions to the Green-Meldrim House over the years have been invaluable. More than a decade ago, she wrote the application for the grant that covered the lion's share of the million-dollar restoration cost of the roof and parapets. More recently, she and Mrs. Beth Reiter (sometime Preservation officer of the Chatham County - Savannah Metropolitan Planning Commission), both transcribed the manuscript ledger kept by the We want it to continue as a Parish House's architect, John Norris, during the construction of the House an unusual and important resource for ongoing historical research. This continuing support of the Meldrim family for St. John's stewardship of the House began (as Jamie Credle told us last Friday) with Frances Casey Meldrim, the widow of Judge Meldrim, and the last private owner of the House, who in her ninth decade sought to ensure its survival by selling it to a sympathetic purchaser.
