HOW WE WORSHIP AND WHY-THE EASTER SEASON

Easter is not just a day, or even a week, but also a season. The forty days of Lent get the lion's share of attention, but the Easter season that follows it also lasts forty days and brings us to the Feast of Ascension, and then ten days later, on the fiftieth day, to Pentecost (which means "fiftieth") – which is why some people will speak of the "Great Fifty Days" of Easter. In the forty days between his resurrection and his ascension Christ appeared to his disciples on several occasions, confirmed their faith in the resurrection, and prepared them for a new mode of fellowship with him, no longer outwardly in the flesh, and limited in time and space, but inwardly in the Spirit and universally accessible. Ten days later, on Pentecost, he poured out this Spirit on his disciples, for the sake of the Church's mission to publish the gospel in the world. In these events the hidden victory he won upon the cross was revealed, its power released, its spoils distributed. For Christians, therefore, this is also a time of transition, not only from sorrow to joy, from sin to righteousness, from death to life, but also from life lived on the basis of merely human resources (what the Bible calls "the flesh") to life lived by the power of God ("the Spirit"). "Alleluia, the Lord is risen: he is risen indeed, alleluia".
