- “O Lord, open thou our lips” etc. (Morning, pp. 7-8; Eve, p. 25)
- Psalm(s) appointed, each ending with:

“Glory be to the Father, to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost; As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.”

- New Testament Lesson
- Canticle: *Benedictus* in the Morning (p. 14)
Magnificat in the Evening (p. 26)

Prayers for God’s Grace
