The Collect for Holy Cross Day: O God, who hast lifted up upon the Cross thine only begotten Son, that he might draw all men unto himself: Grant, we beseech thee; that we who acknowledge the mystery of our redemption on earth, may enjoy its rewards in heaven: through the same thy Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with thee in the unity of the Holy Spirit, ever one God, world without end. *Amen.*

- "O Lord, open thou our lips" etc. (Morning, pp 7-8; Eve, 25)
- Psalm(s) appointed, each ending with:

‘Glory be to the Father, to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost; As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.’
- Old Testament Lesson
- New Testament Lesson
- Cantic: *Benedictus* in the Morning (p 14)
Magnificat in the Evening (p 26)

Prayers for God's Grace

- Apostles' Creed (Morning, p. 15; Evening, 29)
- Versicles & Responses (Morn., 16; Eve, 30-31)

- of the Week, on reverse of this page
- or of the Day
2nd and 3rd Collects (Morning, p 17; Evening, 31)

The Lessons: There are two cycles of lessons in the Prayer Book – those for *daily* Morning and Evening Prayer (printed here), and a second and complementary cycle of those for the Eucharist (or other principal services) on Sundays and other holy days, which are based on the epistles and gospels printed in the Prayer book.
